President's Report

As I sit to down to write this month's report, the thing most in my mind is that Roleystone is a Community Theatre, and the last week has brought that very firmly to mind.

On Tuesday we farewelled one of our more beloved members, John Ramsell, and the Theatre was honoured to offer the venue for the wake.

Then on Friday we hosted a concert to assist one of our young members, Kyle Kash-Gregory, who has been accepted into a 10 week intensive course at the Stella Adler School for Acting in New York. The proceeds from the concert will go towards his tuition and travel costs.

That's two events in one week that are more about us a community than purely putting on shows. One of the more troubling trends in the larger Perth theatre scene has been the decline in people who consider themselves to have a "home club" and just travelling from show to show. Roleystone has been lucky in that we are one of the few clubs that still has a core of dedicated members, and a decent cohort of these nomadic actors, who may not have done anything with us for years, but still consider us their home club.

We need to continue the effort we have been making to provide events for us as a community, and we need you to help. Come to see stuff, join in, or make suggestions. Our core business may be putting on shows, but that's not our only business.

In Remembrance of John Ramsell

Vale John Ramsell 05/11/1948 - 05/04/2015

It is with great sadness that the theatre farewells a long standing member. John Ramsell passed away on Sunday the 5th of April, following a short battle with cancer.

John first joined the theatre with his wife Penny in 1983, for the theatre's then production of My Fair Lady. Whilst he was in chorus for that production, he soon performed many leading roles including Psuedolous in The Funny Thing Happened on the way to the Forum and Judd from Oklahoma!. John was never afraid of make-up and costumes, even willing to go onstage in a dress if required! John was involved in many aspects of the theatre over the years among them acting, singing, directing, as an active committee member (Vice President), set building and painting, working backstage and as a stage manager. He could always be relied on for help with special effects - especially if it involves blowing something up! John's first foray into directing was the musical Oliver! in 1994. He reprised the role of director several more times including directing Oliver! a second time in 2004 and in 2010 directed My Fair Lady as his penultimate show. Although this was supposed to be his last hurrah on our stage, he again graced us with his presence for Much Ado About Nothing in 2012 and The House that Jack Built in 2014, in spite of moving all the way to the tiny country town Nannup. John and Penny's love of theatre flowed on to two of his four children, with Dan and Kat Ramsell still actively involved in the theatre. We spent many a childhood weekend running around the theatre 'helping' paint and build sets. John's love of music and theatre did not remain solely with our lovely theatre. He also graced the stage in The Mikado at His Majesty's Theatre; a touring production of Ruddigore for the Gilbert and Sullivan Society; as Nicely Nicely Johnson for a production of Guys and Dolls; in the 2013 production of Pirates of Penzance for Laughing Horse Productions and as he settled into the Nannup Community, the local Nannup Glee Club. In January of this year, John was diagnosed with a rare brain tumour. His subsequent surgery left him unable to speak and

with limited mobility, however he was still able to come see us one last time, and attended the matinee performance of *Footrot Flats*. By the end of March, his nurse and doctors confirmed his tumour was back and we sadly said goodbye late Sunday evening on the 5th of April.

We (his family) have requested no flowers, however instead are planning a donation of equipment in John's name to the nurses on ward G52 at SCGH, who so wonderfully cared for John. If you wish to contribute, please contact Kat on 0428863241.





ANZAC readings: Conflict and Compassion

"At The Going Down of The Sun"

A tribute to the centenary of the ANZAC landing at Gallipoli



The Roleystone Theatre will be presenting an evocative event in May: *Conflict and Compassion: an Anzac Tribute*. This will be an evening of song and performance - with a focus on the sacrifice of our first ANZACs - especially those who hailed from our own area. This National Trust Heritage festival event is sponsored and brought to you by The City of Armadale, The Roleystone Theatre and Linda's Books.

The first half will feature a reading from local author Linda J Bettenay's book 'Wishes for Starlight'. In this extract two soldiers are reminiscing about their Gallipoli experiences on the night of the evacuation - December 20th 1915. This will be powerfully delivered by actor Paul Peacock.

A light hearted tone will be introduced with a medley of WW1 songs performed by the Armadale Primary School choir led by music teacher Bree Hartley. And yes, the audience is encouraged to sing along to tunes like: A Long Way to Tipperary and Along the Road to Gundagai. This Anzac Tribute will include an original war song written by an Armadale man in 1915. A video tribute will feature many of our local boys and images of that iconic time as a backdrop to performances by Paul and Bree and the choir.

The second half will be the last chance for locals to see: 'At The Going Down of the Sun'; a poignant theatrical performance derived from Bettenay's first book, 'Secrets Mothers Keep'. This moving event features Bree Hartley and Michael Forman from the Roleystone Theatre, with narration by Linda and live music by Kim Bettenay. The performance features actors reading letters from a sweetheart to her soldier boyfriend in Gallipoli. The audience will be brought to tears as the readings end and Kim delivers a powerful rendition of The Last Post played on his lap steel guitar. This should not to be missed. This has played to packed houses over Perth and it is appropriate that the Roleystone Theatre will be the venue for their final performance.

'Conflict and Compassion an Anzac Tribute' is scheduled to be at the Roleystone Theatre on May 15th with a 7:30 arrival time for an 8:00pm start. Tickets will be available, for the very reasonable price of \$5 per head. This will include a complementary sherry on arrival and tea coffee and Anzac biscuits at intermission.
