Get to know your theatre members!

We'll start with Gerry Chapman...

Bobbie and Gerry started together at the Roleystone Theatre in March 1976 and the first show in which he was involved - on stage - was 'Harvey', with Kim Fletcher.

Gerry was elected as vice president in February 1978 - and continued on the committee as VP or President until 1991. He had a break for a few years and then back to it by 1994 until 2002! Then again Gerry was on committee from about 2006 until 2012... about 30 years in total (also ex officio for a couple of years between 2003 to 2005).

Gerry has been in charge of: ticket selling for over 20 years (with Bobbie), theatre maintenance, props and safety... Basically almost all areas both on stage and backstage. Gerry believes his most ambitious achievement was the rebuilding of the orchestra pit, seating tiers, bio box, green room, dressing rooms and foyer. He reports that the Theatre took on a large financial commitment and a whole lot of stress!

Gerry's first production as director was 'The Happiest Days of our Life' but I enjoyed my role in 'One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest' and as the director of 'No Sex Please, We're British'. Gerry has famously enjoyed his role as Chairman in a variety of Old Time Music Halls throughout the years.

Gerry is quoted as saying "changes have been many and varied but the professionalism (if that's a word) has improved every year and our physical plant has improved immeasurably. I have made many good friends and have sadly, farewelled too many, but the future looks bright."

Auditions - The Trip to Bountiful

Directed by Kim Martin

Production Dates: May 9,10,11,14,16,17 2014

This play is by Horton Foote - perhaps best known in Australia for his academy award winning screenplays for TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD and TENDER MERCIES. This play was also made into a movie (for which he was nominated for an Academy award for screenplay) in the 1980s and Geraldine Page won the best Actress award for her performance in it.

It is a poignant story of an ageing widow who lives with her son and daughter-in-law and she has to come to terms with her current circumstances while still longing for the place of her youth. Her trip to her home town of Bountiful helps resolve this for all of them.

The characters are: Carrie Watts - ageing widow (already cast)

Ludie Watts - her son (already cast)

Jessie Mae Watts - her daughter-in-law, late 30s/early 40s- sharp tongued

Thelma - a passenger on Carrie's trip home, 20's

Sheriff - could be any age - preferably 30-50

3 ticket sellers - could be any age, male or female

Jessie Mae is a major role. Thelma and the Sheriff smaller roles.

The ticket sellers are small cameos.

Auditions - A House that Jack Built (Written and directed by Mark Thompson)

Auditions Sunday 5th January Production dates: March 21, 22, 28, 29 in 2014

A House that Jack Built is a modern surreal play about parties' family and friends. It is funny in parts and tragic but also full of the honesty of life, so depth and ability will be required.

Auditions will comprise of 3 components:

 A monologue of your choice, preferably from a modern text, 2 to 5 minutes in length
 A short improvisation based on a given stimulus (Understanding that not all people are comfortable with improvising by themselves the option is available to improvise a dialogue based on the stimulus with another person if you so wish)

3. Grouped reading from A House that Jack Built

Monologue Options: Whilst one always hopes to find a monologue to suit a character it is not necessary. The point of the first monologue is to show off your ability to work with a text and build characters. So give us something fun, bizarre or deathly serious but make sure it's your best work.

Characters:

5 Men, 4 Women, 1 Girl, 2 Boys (all speaking roles).

Age range from: Males - 14 (x2), 25 (x2), mid 30's/40's, 40's, Late 50's/60's.

Females - 14, 25, mid 30's/40's, mid 40's, late 50's/60's.

Vale - Don Morris

Don was a stalwart member of Roleystone theatre, a talented musician and actor.

I first met Don at the theatre in the late seventies and I remember his dedication and attention to detail. He made a replica of the America's Cup for Kim Martin's original musical - Esther -it was almost as good as the original. I remember his gnome song and the large toadstool he made to sit on. I loved his direction in Ruddigore and I remember him dashing off the stage, running around to the front entrance in preparation to take his bow - but Don tripped and broke his ankle. Typically, he made his final bow and then accepted first aid.

Don will always be remembered as a committed member and someone who could always be called upon in times of need.

We all will miss him and our commiserations go Anne and their daughters.

Gerry Chapman.

It was my great pleasure to be a friend of Don's and to work with him for many years at Roleystone Theatre. Don directed the first production I was in at Roleystone (RUDDIGORE in 1977), he was in the first production I directed at Roleystone (PATIENCE in 1979 - for which I don't think he ever completely forgave me for making him wear a blue caftan and long black wig in a modern dress version!), he was in the first musical I wrote for Roleystone and we worked together on stage in several productions as well as Don being in many productions I directed.

He was without doubt one of the most talented and versatile actors I've had the pleasure of working with. The first time I saw Don on stage was as the lead in THE SENTIMENTAL BLOKE and he was outstanding. Although he played many major roles, particularly in musicals, he also loved doing character roles and no part was considered too small, but just a chance to do something different- his range was amazing.

Don was also very skilful with his hands and made many beautiful props (including some wonderful masks for MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING and a beautiful screen for AN IDEAL HUSBAND) and he often helped with set painting. Don was always retiring from being on stage but I was flattered to have him consent to be in several productions I was directing in his later years including his final appearances in THE CRUCIBLE (2010) where he demonstrated he had lost none of his stage presence.

Roleystone Theatre has lost not only one of it's most talented members, but also one of it's most loved members. He died too young and we will all miss him.
