## **President's Report**

In the last "CALL BOY" I mentioned that I was to attend the Presidents meeting called by the I.T.A. This was a great informal meeting (picture below report) although not that well attended. It is good to get together with the other Presidents to discuss issues that we all find common. One thing that is interesting to me is the new online booking service that PLAYLOVERS will be implementing soon. As you know we are trying BOCS this year to help sell some of our tickets. This will be on trial for 12 months & will be reviewed after that. The online ticket booking system does have a lot of advantages that could benefit our Theatre.

The system is called SABO - Seat Advisor Booking System. The system runs on their computer and we access it and our information over the Internet. Any computer with access to the Internet and a web browser can use the system. We can set it up so people can see the seating plan and choose which seats they want, or the system can choose for them on a "next best" basis. People pay by credit card and the money goes straight to our bank. People can print their own ticket at home (each ticket has a unique number so duplicates are avoided )The cost to set this up would not be great. The benefits of implementing this system would be: Provides an additional way that people can book, Ticket payment goes directly into our bank account, We can collect email addresses and add to our mailing list, Seating plan with seats booked/available will be accessible via the web and can be printed out by anyone who is doing the box office for each performance. I will be asking PLAYLOVERS about how the system is working for them, after they have used it for some months and will let you all know. See you at the Theatre.

When you take into account that money must also be spent on costumes, sets and other items it becomes apparent that the balance must be made between the costs to put popular musicals on, and the cost of the tickets to come and see them!
